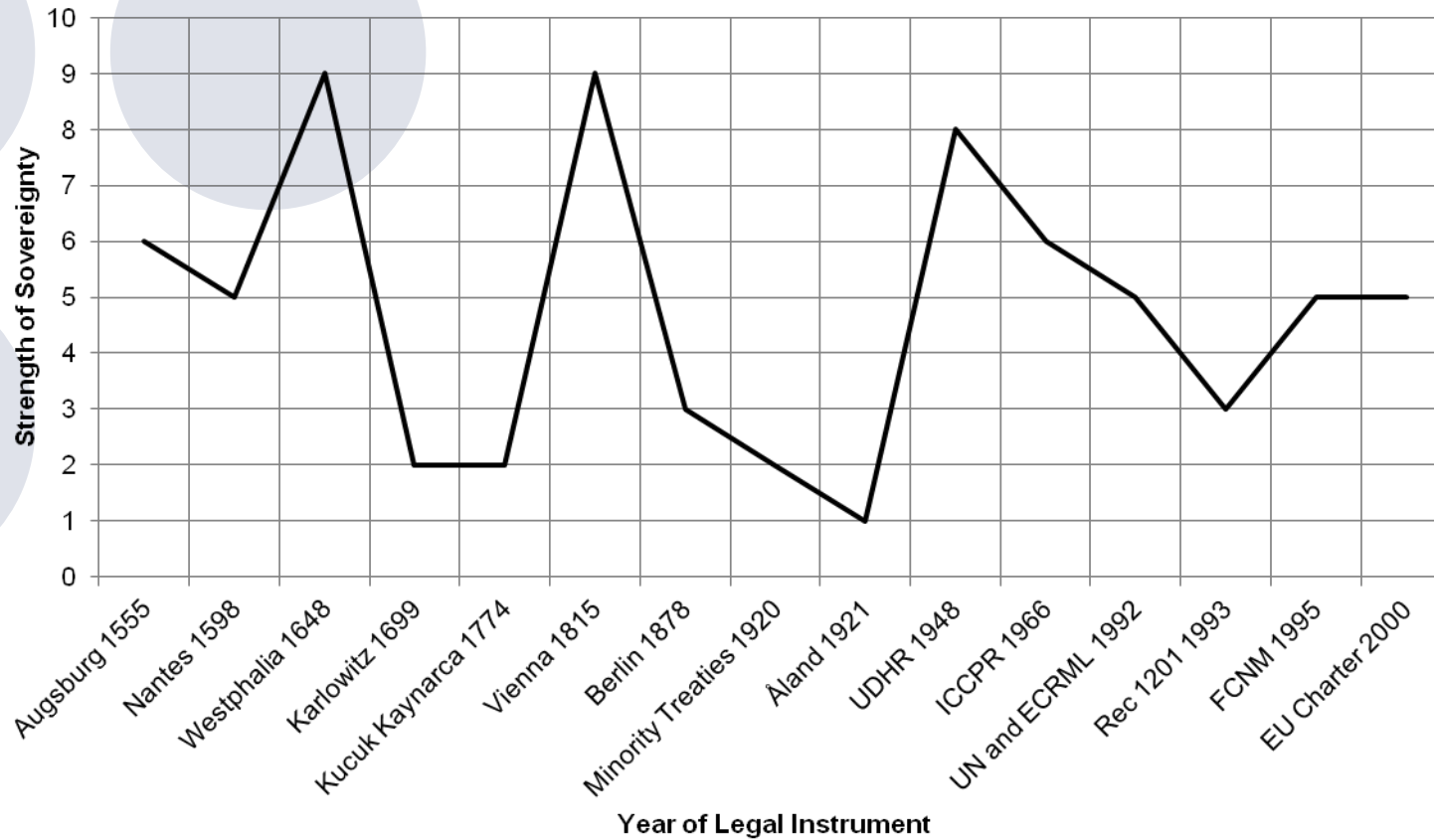


National Sovereignty

- Autonomy as variable

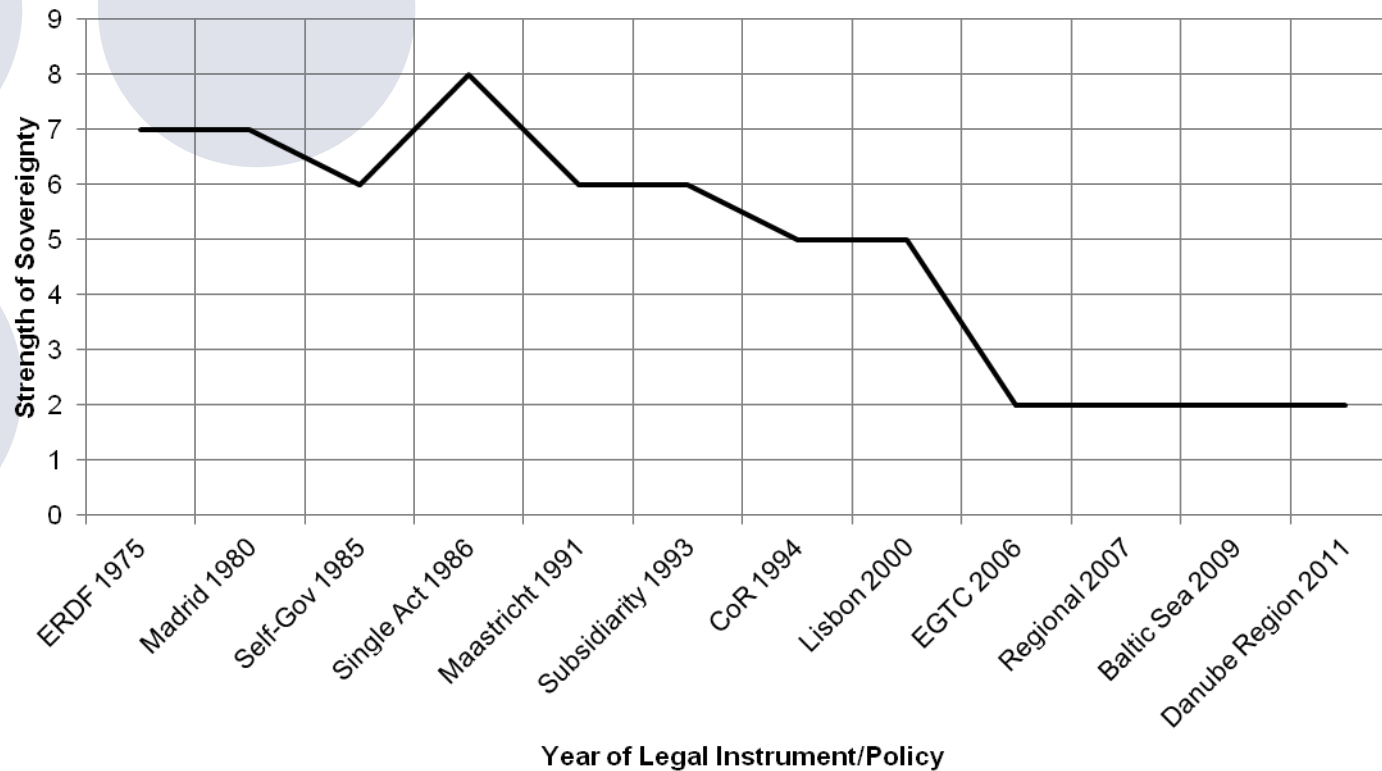



Multi-directional Management


